As we near International Women's Day on the 8th of March, the Year One students learned about the colour purple and how it often represents unity, diversity and inclusion. They learned about fairness and equality through history and the annual Purple Parade in Singapore. In conjunction with our Art unit on Vincent Van Gogh and nature, the students painted pictures of purple irises. They mixed blue and red to achieve their desired shade of purple, adding white to create a lighter shade and black for a darker tone.







The Year 1 students are becoming increasingly confident in drawing still life. In this activity, students showed their personal interpretation of a purple iris while demonstrating our school values of excellence and resilience in their growth as artists.



In Year Two, we learned about influential women, past and present, who through courageous acts, changed history and made the world a fairer place for all. With pictures as guides, students drew portraits of some of these women, and used purple as the central colour and feature to draw out the theme of their art work. We also talked about the concepts of equality, fairness and inclusion and they were challenged to think about how they could play a part in changing the world for a better future.



### **MATHS WEEK**



Maths Week in school was an exciting and engaging event filled with interactive activities designed to enhance students' problem-solving skills. Each morning during form time, pupils worked in pairs to complete time-bounded challenges using counters, dice, whiteboards and glue sticks. Friendly competition and time limits added excitement, motivating pupils to think quickly and accurately.

Maths Week fostered collaboration, critical thinking, and a fun approach to learning mathematical concepts.

## MATHS WEEK - KS1 & 2

Our Year 5 students sharpened their logical thinking skills with Sudoku, tackled the Magic Triangle challenge and cracked secret messages in an Emoji Code-Breaking game, fostering problem solving skills in a fun and engaging way.

















## MATHS WEEK - KS1 & 2

Our Year 6 students took on learning Kakuro, a number logic puzzle often referred to as a mathematical crossword puzzle. They also solved the Magic Triangle and battled it out in a Times Table Battleship game, reinforcing their arithmetic skills through strategic play.

















### **MATHS WEEK-KS3**

Year 7 students tackled three activities. **Activity 1: Magic Puzzles** involved solving algebraic expressions by arranging counters to achieve specific sums, such as arranging a magic cross (totalling 5a + 2) and a magic triangle (each side summing to 3a + 6). **Activity 2: Investigate Multiples on Hundred Grids** required students to colour multiples of chosen numbers on 100-square grids and analyse the resulting patterns. **Activity 3: Prime Factors** included writing numbers as products of prime factors and completing matching division tasks, with calculators permitted for assistance. These tasks reinforced algebraic manipulation, pattern recognition, and prime factorisation skills.

















## **MATHS WEEK-KS3**

In Math Week, Year 8 students completed three activities. Activity 1: The Sieve of Eratosthenes introduced a method for identifying prime numbers. Activity 2: Matching Terms with Their Meanings involved cutting out and pairing terms, definitions, and diagrams under appropriate headings. Activity 3: Naming Angles provided practice in identifying and naming angles in various contexts, such as within triangles and at intersecting lines. These tasks aimed to enhance understanding of prime numbers, mathematical terminology, and geometric concepts, fostering both theoretical knowledge and practical application.
















## **MATHS WEEK-KS3**

Year 9 students engaged in two activities. **Activity 1: Multiplication and Division Square-saws** tested algebra skills through puzzles. Task 1 involved rearranging nine squares into a 3-by-3 grid so that touching sides matched equivalent expressions with one variable, while Task 2 extended this to expressions with two or more variables. **Activity 2: Rounding Numbers** included three tasks: rounding to whole numbers before calculating, rounding to one decimal place before calculating, and rounding after calculating. These tasks aimed to strengthen algebraic manipulation and numerical approximation skills, combining problem-solving with practical application.



#### Swimming Lessons (Year 1,2,3,7,8 & 9)

Swimming lessons will commence on the 3rd of February, following the Chinese New Year break, and will run until the 21st of March, spanning 7 weeks. Currently, the students are participating in offsite PE lessons for approximately 3 to 3.5 weeks while we wait for swimming lessons to commence.

#### Offsite PE Lessons (Year 4,5 & 6)

Students in Years 4, 5, and 6 will not be participating in swimming lessons this term. Instead, they will continue to with their PE lessons offsite at the field.

#### **Additional Notes**

With the weather heating up, keeping our students hydrated during PE lessons is a top priority. Water bottles would be mandatory for all PE lessons. 
